Agenda for Saturday June 7th 2003

10:00 am - The gates of Toronto Buttonville Municipal Airport in Markham Ontario, Canada will open to the public. All motorcycles will be directed out onto the airport tie-down area and parked. All other non-motorcycle traffic will be directed by police to the West side of Hwy 404, off 16th Avenue. Free shuttle bus service (provided by Student Express) will be available throughout the day.

10:30 am - Sky Divers

11:00 am - Vintage Aircraft will begin arriving, including Canada's only airworthy Spitfire, owned and operated by Mr. Mke Potter of Ottawa, Ontario. Mr Potter has kindly waived any appearance fee for this magnificent aircraft in suport of the VHRF.

12:00 noon - Opening ceremonies will begin with a welcome address from the Founder and Chairman of the Board of the VHRF, Mr. Cliff Randall. Cliff will also introduce the many VIPs, both Canadian and US. Cliff will then introduce the master of ceremonies, Captain Charles-Scott Brown, President of the Royal Canadian Military Institute, who will say a few words and then call on the Honour Guard to lead the Veterans (including for the first time, our Canadian Vietnam Veterans) to The Stage of Honour for an 'eyes right' salute from the military leaders, and a thunderous applause from the thousands in attendance! Our VIPs and various Veterans will say a few words, then the audience will be invited up to meet and thank our heroes in person.

The United States Pentagon is sending Major Lisa May to salute our Canadian Vietnam Veterans and to speak about Canada's past and present support of the USA, including the current War on Terrorism. We expect a commemorative fly-by tribute from the US Armed Forces. The Canadian Armed Forces will hopefully make an appearance as well, budgets permitting of course!
